Shropshire and Wrekin Fire Authority 2006/07

n 2006/07, the Fire Authority is investing heavily in its Retained Service.

Retained firefighters are people who have regular jobs and family commitments, but who support their local communities by responding to emergency calls as they occur.

In Shropshire, firefighters who work the retained duty system:

- make up 65% of the workforce
- crew 82% (23 out of 28) of the Authority's fire engines

provide emergency cover to 95% of the county

The Budget Requirement for 2006/07

A budget of £18.296 million has been approved by the Fire Authority. Gross expenditure is netted off with income received (special services, government project support), leaving the following net budget requirement for the year:

Movements in the budget requirement can be summarised as follows:

Pay awards and inflation – provision for pay awards and price increases expected to be paid in 2006/07	+390
Income and Pensions – the firefighters pension scheme will no longer be held in the revenue account, resulting in a reduction in both budget requirement and government grant	-322
Reserves and balances – no increases were necessary in 2006/07; in addition, funds have been released to repay modernisation grant, awarded by government in 2004/05	-397
Efficiencies – efficiencies have been achieved in running the service	-336
Retained Service – there has been a significant investment in the retained service, which will benefit the service and the public	+824
Grant amendments – central government have reduced grant levels for 2004/05 and 2005/06, which must be repaid	+170
Developments net of efficiencies – additional costs, such as funding the capital programme, set off by reductions in costs	+19

Capital Programme

Capital schemes to be undertaken by the Fire Authority in 2006/07 include replacement of operational appliances and refurbishment to retained stations. The impact of new schemes is less than 62p per annum at Band D.

Funding the Budget Requirement

The Fire Authority receives grant and rates income from central government, and the balance of the budget requirement is funded from council tax.
